The tree was burned, but it sprouted later. The dead tree standing next to it is a cherry tree burned by the atomic bomb.

The temple was established in Yoshida to the north of Hiroshima in the early 16th century. It was moved to this location in 1590 at about the same time when the feudal lord Mori Terumoto built Hiroshima Castle and moved from Yoshida to Hiroshima. This was one of the biggest temples in Hiroshima until it was burned by the atomic bombing.
