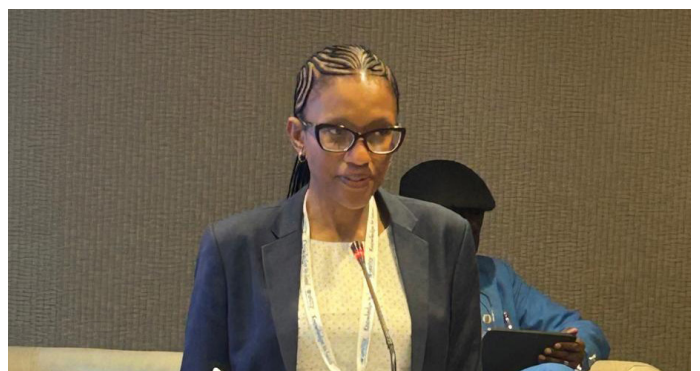
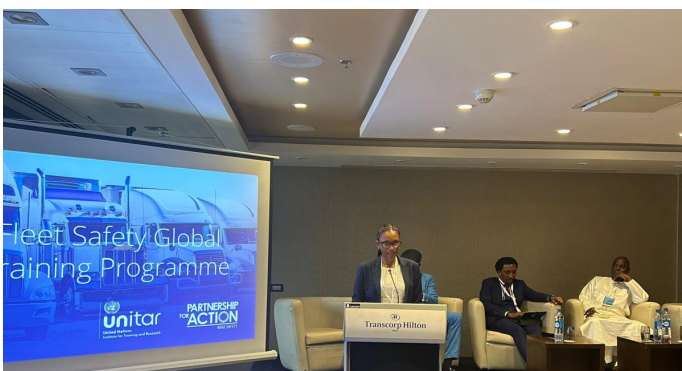


SPOTLIGHT ON CITY'S FLEET MANAGEMENT SYSTEM AT UN PROGRAMME

This opportunity arises from the launch of the Fleet Safety Global Training Programme, a flagship initiative of the United Nations held on 30 and 31 July.

The programme, implemented in four African countries including The Gambia, Nigeria, Senegal, and South Africa, aims to enhance fleet management practices and promote road safety. Coordinated by the eThekweni Municipal Academy and Cifal Durban, the programme will train approximately 8 500 Municipal

drivers in comprehensive fleet management, covering aspects such as professional driving, road safety, maintenance, and fuel-saving measures. The initiative aims to reduce Municipal expenditure on maintenance, fuel, and repairs by 50 percent over the next three years. Professor Mpilo Ngubane, Executive Director of Cifal Durban, said the programme's primary social benefit is enhanced safety.

"The successful implementation of this programme will not only improve road safety but also contribute to significant cost savings for the Municipality. By sharing best practices and expertise, eThekweni Municipality is poised to make a lasting impact on fleet management in the region," said Ngubane.
