About the Programme

The Master of Arts in Gender and Development (hybrid and online) is a graduate programme that offers critical knowledge in gender studies in its intersections with development studies. In addition, this programme equips students with the required soft skills for a successful international career in this field. The programme will consist of in-person and face- to-face sessions with online asynchronous courses provided by UNITAR. Students can also participate in optional field visits to Geneva, Switzerland, and/or The Hague, the Netherlands.

The M.A. in Gender and Development is offered by the internationally recognised Department of Peace and Conflict Studies of the University for Peace (UPEACE) and the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR). During this programme, students will analyze different perspectives, which is necessary for nurturing gender consciousness in development work, focusing on a variety of topics, including, but not

limited to. women's empowerment, aueerina gender in its intersections with development, environment and development, the interplay of gender, sexuality, race, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, and disability, and other factors. Students will also attend skills development and coaching sessions that are designed to support their professional career and employability. Careers in this field can be very broad. Prospective employers include governments. international and regional organizations, think tanks, academia, human rights organizations, and the civil society.

Students can also pursue a shorter programme, namely the **Certificate in Gender and Development** (hybrid or online), or sign up for individual online courses offered as part of the Master of Arts in Gender and Development, or Certificate in Gender and Development.



Who is it for?

The programme is designed for graduate students, diplomats, government officers, NGO representatives, international civil servants, professionals, or anyone interested in and willing to strengthen their knowledge in gender and development.

Students must complete the Master of Arts in Gender and Development in two semesters.



Online

Students can complete the Master of Arts in Gender and Development, and the Certificate in Gender and Development, in up to four semesters.

Credits and Enrolment Fees

M.A. in Gender and Development: Hybrid

Students can obtain the Master of Arts in Gender and Development (hybrid) upon successful completion of 41 credits, including 33 credits for coursework and 8 credits for a master's thesis or internship assignment. Students who choose Capstone as their Graduation Project must take an additional 3-credit course (37-course credits and 5 Capstone credits):



(*)UN Staff and Costa Rican nationals will be eligible for a 50% waiver (9,750 USD). All other applicants may apply for a 20% waiver (15,600 USD) which may be granted in limited numbers by mutual decision of UPEACE and UNITAR to ensure equitable gender and regional representation.

Students can obtain the MA in Gender and Development upon successful completion of 42 credits, including 36 credits for course work and 6 credits for a final independent research project (IRP). In order to graduate from the programme, students must undertake the courses marked as 'Mandatory' (28 credits) in the list below. In addition, students must take optional courses (8 credits) from the list, before completing their final graduation project (IRP).

Optional Field Visits to Geneva and/or The Hague

During this activity, students will have the opportunity to immerse themselves in the very heart of diplomacy, visit different international organizations and network with other diplomats, personnel of permanent missions accredited to the UN, civil servants of international organizations and civil society representatives.

Students can sign up for one field visit or for both (Geneva and The Hague), if they wish to do so. Students will spend 5 days in Geneva (Switzerland), and 5 days in The Hague (Netherlands). The fee for each five-day field trip is USD 1,500. If students register for both field visits, the ten-day field trip is USD 3,000. The fee does not include travel, accommodation, food, or visa expenses.






About UNITAR






About UPEACE
