Institutional Mechanism - Core Group



PIOJ - comprehensive, integrated and holistic approach to policy, planning and programme formulation around the pillars of sustainable development

STATIN - the national statistics office with responsibility for monitoring and reporting the SDG indicators

JAMAICA'S NATIONAL STATISTICS SYSTEM

- ☐ The statistical landscape in Jamaica is currently legislated by the Statistics Act that was adopted in 1949 and last amended in 2003 The Act gives the organization some level of autonomy Independent governance structure includes Board of Director Independent in administration such as in its hiring policies, methodologies Act provides the mandate for data collection such as to conduct all censuses in Jamaica, to collect economic and social data data ☐ The Act does not define the roles and responsibilities of other data producers vis-à-vis STATIN.
- It also does not legislate on the definition of official statistics. As such, there is no formal clarity or definition of what constitutes the Novemational statistical system of Jamaica.



PRODUCERS OF OFFICIAL STATISTICS IN JAMAICA

 Official statistics in Jamaica are produced in a decentralized system and in the absence of a coordinated framework.


Data Quality Framework

- In the absence of a national statistical system, there is no common quality standard shared among official data producers in Jamaica.
- However, an inter-agency Data Standards Monitoring Committee, including STATIN, the Bank of Jamaica and the Ministry of Finance and the Public Service, is tasked with guiding the country to meet the requirements of the IMF's Special Data Dissemination Standard (SDDS).
- The SDDS sets specific criteria for the coverage, periodicity, timeliness, accessibility, integrity and quality of disseminated data.



Data Quality Assurance Framework

- ☐With support from Statistics Canada, STATIN has developed a Data Quality Assurance Framework in line with norms established by the UN Statistical Commission.
- ☐ Jamaica is member of Statistical Commission's National Quality Assurance Framework Expert Group.


