



TRADE, FOOD SECURITY & NUTRITION

11 MAY - 12 JUNE 2020

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

This course seeks to strengthen capacities of post-Soviet countries to develop and implement trade policies, taking into consideration their implications for food security and nutrition. The course will allow participants to assess the challenges and opportunities posed by greater openness to trade, evaluate different types of trade policy measures and their role in promoting food security, and to formulate agricultural trade policies and strategies, taking into consideration the international trade rules.



CONTENT & STRUCTURE

The course is composed of four units:

- 1. Introduction to Trade, Food Security and Nutrition
- 2. Trade Policy Supportive of Food Security
- 3. Governance of Trade, Food Security and Nutrition
- 4. Trade, Food Security and Nutrition in Europe and Central Asia

TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is designed to assist representatives from Ministries of Agriculture as well as other government ministries and officials directly involved in the formulation and implementation of trade, agricultural and food security policies and programs in the post-Soviet countries. Participants from the private sector and civil society could also benefit from the course. Researchers and students with interest in food security and trade analysis are also encouraged to participate.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

This course is offered free of charge and conducted in Russian language only from 11 May to 12 June 2020. The course will be delivered online with optional and required readings, case study exercises, discussion forums and assessment quizzes. The course facilitation and mentorship will provided by international experts. Limited slots are available and will be subject to a selection process conducted by FAO, taking into account, in particular, the geographical distribution and gender balance. Female candidates are strongly encouraged to apply. A certificate of completion will be issued to participants who successfully complete all course-related assignments and assessments.
