### Nuclear Disarmament and Non-Proliferation Training for Diplomats Held in Hiroshima



Nearly 20 diplomats and government officials from Asian countries completed the [UNITAR Hiroshima Nuclear Disarmament and Non-Proliferation Training Programme](#), held 13-18 February 2023. The diplomats updated their understanding of the global nuclear debate and met young activists to learn about their initiatives for a nuclear-free world. The programme's past two cycles were run virtually due to COVID-19-related restrictions. Learning about nuclear disarmament and non-proliferation in the symbolic city of Hiroshima offered participants a deep learning experience.

## A Digital Change-making Storyteller Inspiring Digital Inclusion for Older People





## FAO-UNITAR E-Learning Course on Trade, Food Security and Nutrition Concludes in Latin America

The Spanish edition of the FAO and UNITAR joint e-learning course on “Trade, Food Security, and Nutrition” for Latin American policymakers, which started in September 2022, is concluded. Seventy participants from 16 countries were selected to participate in the course. The course helped strengthen policymakers’ capacity to design and implement agricultural, food-security and trade policies that combat hunger, food insecurity and

malnutrition. The programme was first launched in 2017 and has been one of FAO and UNITAR's longest-running joint programmes.
