2024 UNITAR Training Programme on Leave no one behind: Rapid response to climate crises through Early Warning Systems

“**Leave No One Behind: Rapid Response to Climate Crises through Early Warning Systems**” will equip individuals and communities in the Pacific island countries with the knowledge and skills to effectively disseminate, monitor, analyse and respond to early warning signals for climate-related hazards and extreme-weather events.

The programme will run in two phases from July – November 2024. Through the course, you will engage in online courses, workshops, and coaching and mentoring sessions in key topics related to early warning systems. Top-performers will be invited to come together for an in-person workshop in Japan.

The programme will be delivered in **English**. You will receive a UNITAR certificate of completion if you complete the course and meet minimum criteria.

The programme is free for participants and conducted by the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR) with the financial support of the Government and the People of Japan.

Who Is Eligible?

The programme is open to **motivated individuals from the government, private sector and civil society organizations**, who are:

- Eager to learn about new technologies, early warning systems (EWS) and its applications for disaster risk reduction
- Passionate about climate change and its impact on communities
- Keen to succeed and make a positive impact on their communities
- Proficient in the English language
- Computer literate with access to the internet
- Committed to completing the programme

The countries included in this programme are:

Pacific Islands Countries: Cook Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, Fiji, Kiribati, Marshall Islands, Nauru, Niue, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Tuvalu, Vanuatu

What Is The Programme Structure?

The programme will run in two phases:

For **Phase I, 180 motivated leaders from the government, civil and private sectors** will enrol in a self-paced online course to study general topics relating to early warning systems. Participants will also join webinars and have access to supplemental resources. Each participant will develop a project plan.

In **Phase II, 30 of the top-performing participants will be selected for an in-depth, face to face workshop in Japan**. The participants will be coached to develop a group country presentation, where they will fine-tune their individual plans, and will present them to peers and experts at the end of Phase II. These 30 participants will be recognized as our “Shimanami Masterminds”.



What Will You Learn?

“Leave No One Behind: Rapid Response to Climate Crises through Early Warning Systems” aims to provide individuals and communities in the Pacific Island countries with the knowledge and skills to effectively disseminate, monitor, analyse and respond to early warning signals for climate-related hazards and extreme-weather events.

By promoting more reliable and timely climate information and the widespread adoption of multi-hazard early warning systems, this programme will build resilience in the Pacific and empower people at risk to take timely and appropriate actions to mitigate risks and reduce the impact of disasters. Ultimately, it will help save lives and reduce the negative social and economic impact of climate-related hazards. Participants will:

- Develop an appreciation for EWS for resilience
- Understand the different components and technologies for EWS
- Develop an increased understanding of multi-hazard EWS
- Develop an appreciation for Indigenous and scientific knowledge, and
- Learn through exposure to the technological advancements and research in the area of EWS in Japan.



What Is The Programme Schedule?

The training programme will take place in two phases from **July - November 2024**. The programme will launch online on **9 July 2024**. You will be expected to dedicate approximately **2 – 4 hours per week** to fully take part in the programme.
