

2018 SAICM regional meetings



Proposal on objectives in support of the 2030 Agenda and related milestones (SAICM/IP.2/8)

Centred on the 11 basic elements, aspirational in nature, and limited in number.

They are grouped around four key areas:

- I. Legal frameworks, implementation and enforcement
- II. Institutional frameworks, stakeholder participation, and sectoral engagement
- III. Information, risk assessment/reduction and monitoring
- IV. Political leadership, outreach, and promotion



Second intersessional process will:

- Review the proposed objectives and milestones and consider if those objectives would support a programme of work beyond 2020 that will deliver the overall vision.
- Reflect upon an effective process for undertaking reviews and performance measurement, including:
 - How to engage stakeholders.
 - How reporting could be coordinated with efforts under relevant international agreements and contribute towards the achievement of the 2030 Agenda.



Further considerations on the objectives proposal

- Going beyond the focus on the 11 elements of the Overall Orientation and Guidance, which consider mainly national and regional actions.
- Learning lessons from other areas, such as biodiversity.
- Considering approaches to set global, regional and national priorities and provide more details on specific actions, timeframes and indicators.
- Specifying roles and responsibilities of different stakeholders and sectors that will be working together to achieve objectives and facilitate the review of progress.


